Lory Duralia, Bosky Dell Natives

f you've never met a pixie, visit Bosky Dell Natives, an extraordinary nursery that features native Oregon plants. The owner, Lory Duralia, she of pixie-like stature and tiny voice, is a living embodiment of a magical forest creature, striving to keep earth's treasures — all plants, animals, fish, birds and humans — in harmony.

"I've always loved nature," says Lory. "My parents were tired of asking me to clean my room, so they offered an alternative — to take care of the garden." She thrived there and built her first pond at age eight.

As a single mother she moved her family to the bucolic rural landscape of West Linn. "Over several offers, the home owner chose me," says Lory. That owner had a small native plant nursery when, 20 years ago, attention to the unique usefulness of natives was rare. "She asked if I would keep her nursery going and taught me everything I needed to know."

Since that early start, Bosky Dell Natives is renowned as the "go-to" place for native Oregon plants (over 300) and the friendly expertise.

"To think," says Lory. "Not so long ago, it was just me, a card table in the middle of a field with a dream..."

That dream has blossomed, literally, and a visit to Bosky Dell will charm you with its quirky garage/store, vignettes of pottery, stones, fences and flowers, gorgeous gardens and kid-friendly Field's Stream with trout, salamanders and rare red-legged frogs. In fact, Lory was awarded the Green Heron Award for the protection and restoration of the stream — a massive project involving many volunteers.

At Bosky Dell, you'll see the connectedness of bees, butterflies, and birds with certain plants and learn how you, too, can make a positive difference in the environment. You'll find classes too, including Native American use of medicinal plants.

Bosky Dell...it even sounds like a magical place, no?
