How to Get Your Treehate


- Purchase a tree*.
- 2 Plant it at a residence in the City of Portland.
- **3** Complete and submit the attached form by May 1, 2010. Include the tree purchase receipt with the purchase price circled.
- 4 Receive credit on your utility bill (50% of the purchase price up to \$40, up to \$50 if a native tree).
- * Generally, most tree species are eligible for a Treebate; see the eligible list for conditions and ineligible list for exclusions.

Eliqible Trees

- ✓ Trees planted in Portland residential yards
- ✓ Trees with trunks measuring at least 1 inch in diameter 6 inches above the soil line that are at least 6 feet tall if broadleaf or 4 feet tall if coniferous (needle) at time of planting
- ✓ Trees purchased, planted and submitted with proof of purchase between September 1 and May 1

Native Trees

Tree species native to the Portland area are well suited to our climate, and planting native trees helps create habitat connections throughout the city. For these reasons you earn a 50% rebate up to \$50 for planting a native tree. Visit portlandonline.com/bes/treebate or a local nursery for information on native species.

Ineligible Trees

- ✓ Trees planted in the street right of way or any other non-residential location
- ✓ Trees that do not meet the size requirements detailed in the eligible trees list
- ✓ Trees purchased, planted and submitted during the months of May, June, July and August
- ✓ Trees otherwise subsidized by the city (e.g., planted with Friends of Trees)
- ✓ Trees planted to replace existing trees or to satisfy a condition of development or mitigation
- ✓ Dwarf species, arborescent shrubs and hedges (e.g., dwarf fruit trees, small ornamental conifers, arborvitae)
- ✓ Trees on the City Nuisance Plant List below:

Late fall through early spring is prime tree plant-ing season. Be sure to plant your tree correctly and give it proper care. Newly planted trees require deep weekly watering (~10 gallons) during the dry summer season from June through September.
